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ANNEX: LIST OF RECOGNIZED HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS

The following is a partial list of recognized human rights violations under relevant international law. There may be additional violations which are not listed; you are free to describe any conduct which you believe constitutes a violation.

- Unlawful killings/ Extrajudicial executions/ Arbitrary deprivation of life
- Enforced disappearances
- Violation of freedom of movement
- Arbitrary detention, including of children
- Torture and cruel, inhumane or degrading treatment
- Excessive use of force
- Violations of liberty and security of person
- Violations of the right to peaceful assembly
- Violations of the right to freedom of opinion and expression (including access to information online and offline).
- Violations of the right to freedom of association.
- Sexual or gender-based violence (against persons of any gender/age/sexual orientation)
- Violations of the rights of the child (e.g., right to education)
- Violations of the right to fair trial and due process
- Violations of the right to work (e.g. unfair or politically motivated dismissals), to strike, and to form / join trade unions
- Violations of the right to adequate food
- Violations of the right to health
- Slavery or forced labour
- Violations of the right of access to truth and information
- Conditions in Detention
- Forced repatriation
- Corruption, cyber-crime, financial crimes
